Yasuaki Takeji (Kanazawa University, Japan)

Dr. Yasuaki Takeji is currently an assistant professor in the Department of Cardiovascular Medicine at the Kanazawa University Graduate School of Medical Sciences, Japan. He is now the instructor and main operator of PCI, EVT, and intervention to SHD.

He received his MD degree from Kanazawa University, Japan, in 2013 and his PhD degree in Clinical Research from the Kyoto University Graduate School of Medicine, Japan, in 2018.

After graduating, he worked as a resident at Toranomon Hospital in Japan. Subsequently, he trained as a fellow at Kokura Memorial Hospital in Japan. During his doctoral studies, he focused on clinical research related to atherosclerotic diseases such as coronary artery disease, acute myocardial infarction, and aortic stenosis. He managed several large cohort studies on coronary artery disease and aortic stenosis. He is currently managing large cohort studies on aortic stenosis to clarify the risk stratification of asymptomatic aortic stenosis. His recent research interests include genetic and epidemiologic research on atherosclerosis especially about familial hypercholesterolemia.

He is a fellow of the American College of Cardiology, the Japanese Circulation Society, and the Japanese Association of Cardiovascular Intervention and Therapeutics.
